We would like to thank you for the trust you place in our stallions. Please, kindly read carefully our breeding regulations.

Haras de Bouquetot, $\mathit{1^{st}}$ stallion station to adopt a biosecurity plan in France



No mare will be covered unless we have the following:

- → <u>Copies of the vaccinations and swabs results</u> sent by e-mail before the covering to: segolene@bouquetot.com or stephanie@bouquetot.com
- → Original passport with a SIRE number and French markings as well as the original copies of the swabs results.

These breeding regulations concern the <u>mares with</u> the <u>valid "low risk" status</u>, so, please before covering, **make sure that the sanitary status of your mare is valid.**

These breeding requirements are for low risk mare only.

High risk mare:

- → Mares who have had previous contact with CEMO.
- → Mares who originate from countries outside France, Germany, Ireland, Italy and the United Kingdom in the last 12 months.

HIGH RISK MARE:



High risk mare requirements:

- → Get two negatives clitoral swabs (sinus and fossa) 7 days apart and a negative cervical swab, taken during oestrus*, before the covering & after the 1st of January.
- → Then follow the low risk regulations.

*Certified by a Horserace Betting Levy Board Designated Laboratory (UK) or another National Approved Laboratory in Germany, Ireland or France.



EQUINE VIRAL ARTERITIS EVA



(ANALYSES TO BE DONE BY A **NATIONAL APPROVED LABORATORY**)

Taken after the 1st of January and dated less than 30 days before the first cover.

Approved results:

- → Either 1 negative serological or ELISA result
- → Either 2 positives serological results that are constants or declining at 14 days apart
- → Either 1 positive serological result that is constant or declining compare to the last result from the previous year.
- → Either 1 positive ELISA result & 2 positives serological results that are constants or declining at 14 days apart (Analyses by the same approved laboratory)



COMPULSORY VACCINATIONS PROTOCOL

(BEFORE THE COVER)



ANY BREAK IN THE VACCINATION PROTOCOL WILL REQUIRE A NEW PRIMARY VACCINATION BEFORE THE FIRST COVER.

Equine Influenza (Flu) et Rhinopneumonia (EHV):

- → Either 1 annual booster for the past 3 years, then every 6 months
- → Either <u>1 primary vaccination</u> then 2 injections spaced out 3 to 6 weeks apart, finally 1 <u>annual booster</u> for the past 3 years, better every 6 months

Primary vaccination: 2 injections spaced out 3 to 6 weeks apart



SPECIFICS CASES



NASAL SWAB

(FOR FILLIES OUT OF TRAINING FOR LESS THAN 30 DAYS)

→ Flu and EHV results negatives



EQUINE INFECTIOUS ANEMIA EIA - Coggins Test

(FOR ANY MARE COMING FROM ABROAD)

→ Negative Coggins test done after the 1st of January and less than 30 days before the cover.



TEST DOURINE

(FOR ANY MARE COMING FROM A COUNTRY NON UNHURT OF DOURINE, E.G. ITALY)

→ Negative serological Dourine test, done at least 14 days after her arrival at the boarding stud.



ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS

- → If the mare returns to heat in an unusual way: do over all the CEM tests as well as other bacterial diseases.
- → If the mare is changed from one stallion to another during the course of the breeding season: We require:
 - ► New clitoral swabs
 - ► EVA tests
 - ► These should be taken no sooner than 7 days after the mare was last covered by the original stallion.
 - ▶ Previous results must be submitted.
- → If the mare is changed from boarding stud, new tests (all of them) will be required.
- → Additional swabbing and/or other tests may be required in certain circumstances at the stallion stud manager's discretion.
